

What Does My Child Need to Know for Kindergarten?

Here is an overview of skills your child should practice before entering school in the fall.

Listening/Speaking

Math

- Listen to stories without interrupting
- Recognize rhyming sounds
- Pay attention for short periods of time to adult-directed tasks
- Follow 2-step directions
- Speak in complete sentences
- Make comparisons between objects such as big/little

Count to ten

- Identify numbers 1–5
- Correspondence counting (one-to-one counting)
- Sort similar objects by color, size, and shape
- ☐ Identify basic shapes and colors
- Understand more than and less than

Social/Emotional

- Understand actions have both causes and effects
- \Box Start to follow rules and share
- Separate from parents without being upset
- Speak understandably
- Manage bathroom needs independently

Phonological Awareness and Print Knowledge

- Recite the alphabet and identify most of the letters
- Identify rhyming words
- Identify the beginning sound of some words
- Write name
- Retell a story

Motor Skills

- Cut with scissors
- Hold pencil correctly
- Trace basic shapes
- \Box Hop, jump, run, bounce a ball



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
